

She gave an excellent presentation of the type of treatments available for prostate cancer patients including Theranostics, which is a relatively new approach to cancer treatment. It is used to treat some patients who have not responded to other cancer treatments or who have complex metastases (where the cancer has spread to other sites outside the prostate).

Our speaker on 9th November will be Thomas Harris who is a Men's Health Physiotherapist from Ramsay Health Care. Tom will speak about the importance of pelvic floor exercises and their role in pre and postoperative PC treatment management. He will also be offering advice on keeping fit and his role at Ramsay Health and Northwest Private in relation to health maintenance.
